SEA Need-Based Financial Assistance

Applying for financial assistance will not affect your chances for admission. A limited number of need-based scholarships are available. To apply for a need-based scholarship, send the following to the SEA Admission Office:

- A letter explaining your family's financial situation. Include the number of children in college or private schools; special circumstances such as high medical bills or unemployment; or other pertinent information. Also include the amount that you and your family can contribute toward the program cost.
- Your supporting parent's 2016 Federal Tax Return. Use the 2015 tax return if the 2016 is unavailable.

Financial aid applications are due by April 20, 2016. Awards are determined after acceptance to the program; recipients will be notified by email. No awards will be determined prior to January 31, 2016.

Additional Assistance

In the past, students have obtained scholarships on their own. Check with local organizations such as the Rotary Club, Knights of Columbus, Garden Club, Audubon Society, the local public library, and your own high school.
